



FAQ

1. Who decides if the League is a “Traditional” or “And Under” program?
 - Answer: The League’s Board of Directors decides.
2. How many Age Groups can a player play up?
 - Answer: The Player will be allowed to play up one age group. For example, a Traditional Bronco (11-12) player can play up into Pony “And Under” (11-14)
3. How young can a player be in the Shetland (4-5-6) program?
 - Answer: No younger than four (4) years old.
4. Can a player play on two age group teams at one time?
 - Answer: Yes, if allowed by the League.
5. Is the player eligible to play on either tournament team?
 - Answer: Yes, if the player has participated in half of his regular season games and follows all other eligibility rules.
6. Will the “And Under” Program also play with the Traditional Program when it comes to World Series play?
 - Answer: Yes, there will only be one tournament for Traditional and “And Under”.
7. If a player is playing in two age groups at the same time which pitching rules apply?
 - Answer: The rules of the older Traditional Age Group.
8. Are the Bronco-11 and Pony-13 Tournament Teams part of the “And Under” Program?
 - Answer: Yes, players from one age group below can play on these tournament teams. For example, an 11 or 12 year old can play on a Pony-13 Tournament Team.
